

Retired Mechanic Arthur Lockhart of Ranger Dies

RANGER (RNS) - Arthur (Bill) Lockhart, 68, a resident of Ranger six years, died at Sunrise Manor Nursing Home In Eastland at 6:55 am. Monday.

Funeral will be held at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Killingsworth Funeral Chapel with the Rev. K. C. Edmonds, retired Baptist minister, officiating. Burial will be in the Alameda Cemetery.

Born Aug. 20, 1895 in Hamilton, he came to the Alameda Community south of Ranger from Hamilton in 1903 and had been a resident of Eastland County most of his life.

Mr. Lockhart was a retired mechanic. He married Elnora Bennett in 1925 in Denver, Colo. She died in March of 1963 in Florence, Colo.

He was a member of the Baptist church, a veteran of World War I and a member of the American Legion.

Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Harry E. Deal of Ranger; half-sister, Mrs. Pearl Stewart of Lockhart; a number of nieces and nephews.
